We are delighted to announce that we will be welcoming new members to the ERN CRANIO network from 1st January 2022.

The ERN Board of Member States recently approved 620 applicants across the ERNs and membership will begin from 1 January 2022. Via these links you can see lists of the new members sorted both [by ERN](#) and [by Member State](#).

ERN CRANIO will welcome 14 new member hospitals, across an additional five countries. One Affiliated Partner hospital from Lithuania and one from Austria will become full members.

This means that from 1 January 2022, ERN CRANIO will have:

- ◇ 36 member hospitals across 15 EU/EEA countries
- ◇ 7 affiliated partner hospitals from an additional 6 countries
- ◇ **In total: 43 hospitals from 21 EU/EEA countries**

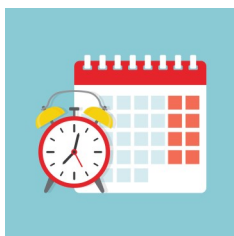
